What to bring for the workshop:

Morning - Border 1

• Background black or dark solid fabric, 1/2 yard



- Geese light fabric, fat quarter
- Another light fabric for additional geese, 1/2 yard



Afternoon - "Migrating Geese"

- Background fabric light solid, non-directional, 1/2 yard
- For 3 different colored geese, bring 3 fat quarters of coordinating fabrics.

Also bring the following items you need to sew your borders:

- Sewing Machine
- Iron
- Small ironing board (if possible)
- your Magic Wand Ruler
- Marking pencil or pen
- Your normal sewing stuff (rulers, seam rippers, scissors, rotary cutters and mat, pins)
