June Quilt Camp

SSQG Quilt Camp will be **June 24, 25, and 26, 2022, 8 am to 8 pm each day**, at the **Shawnee Masonic Lodge** on Kickapoo Spur. Get ready to come enjoy some fellowship and just good quilting fun. We will provide pizza on Sunday for lunch, but we are doing our own things for lunch the other days. Feel free to bring desserts or snacks to share if you wish.

Cost for the camp is \$10 per day for paid-up members. Bring a friend with you! For non-members, the cost is \$10 dues (discounted since it's midway through the year) plus \$10 per day.

An educational activity at Camp on Saturday is Jelly Roll Placemats. June Cramer and her girls will show us how to make these unique placemats. They will also bring the die for the Accuquilt microwave bowl, and the Guild will have the 2½ inch die for the Jelly Roll Placemat project.

Things to bring to the camp if you are going to make the Jelly Roll Placemats:

- Jeans needles for your sewing machine
- Walking foot
- 2 Jelly Rolls, 2½ inch (makes 4 placemats 20 x 20)
- Batting

If anyone wants to use one of the Accuquilt dies we have, just let Marilyn Johnson know so she can bring them to camp.

We always have many "Ta Das", where quilters show their wonderful works of art each day. Come enjoy the fellowship with us and bring your projects that you want to get done.
