


## **July Barn Quilt Program**

# **Recipe for Homemade Peach Ice Cream**

# Ingredients

- · 4 cups chopped peaches (peels removed)
- 2½ cups sugar (divided)
- · 4 cups heavy cream
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

#### Instructions

- 1. Mix chopped peaches with 1 cup sugar in a large bowl. Allow to set for about 15 minutes so the peach pieces release their juices.
- 2. Blend peaches up in a blender or food processor until nice and smooth. (Add ½ cup of your whole milk if you need more liquid to blend it up.)
- 3. In a large bowl, combine peach mixture with heavy cream, whole milk, vanilla, and remaining 1½ cups sugar.
- 4. Pour the peach mixture into the ice cream maker. Freeze until firm.

Note: This makes enough for a 4 quart ice cream freezer.
