December Program

For the block exchange, bring anywhere from one to twelve $6\frac{1}{2}$ " pieced or appliquéd blocks (that will finish to 6"). Be sure to sign and date all of your blocks.

For the fat quarter exchange, bring two fat quarters in an opaque bag.
