The rodeo quilt raffle was a big success this year. We sold \$1,258 worth of tickets, and the guild's costs were minimal, so most of that amount goes toward our guild's operating costs. The winner of the quilt was 13-year-old Marshal Owens from near Tecumseh. Marshal is a cowboy who competes in various events, but he did not complete in this year's rodeo. Congratulations to Marshal! (Marshal's family was supposed to send a photo, but it has not yet been received.)

We actually gave away a second rodeo quilt at this year's rodeo. A young girl named **Bailey Holmes** lost her horse in a freak accident on her way to the rodeo. The hay in her horse trailer caught fire (presumably from a discarded cigarette or something similar), destroying the trailer and killing her horse. We already had a quilt almost completed that we were going to use for next year's rodeo, but we decided to gift that quilt to Bailey. So the quilt was quickly completed and given to Bailey's mother, Alaina Holmes (in the white tank top on the left), since Bailey had already gone home with her father. Thanks to those guild members who worked on this quilt. I'm sure Bailey and her family appreciate it.

Minutes from General Meeting on June 1, 2023





August 2023 Block of the Month - Schoolhouse



Block size: 12" finished (12½" unfinished)

Cutting Instructions

Background (sky):

- A one 1½" x 12½" rectangle
- B two 11/2" x 101/2" rectangles
- C two 3½" squares

Grass

D - two 1½" x 4½" rectangles

Walkway:

• E - one 11/2" x 61/2" rectangle

Roof:

- F two 3½" x 4½" rectangles
- G two 1" x 2½" rectangles
- H two 1½" squares

School Bell:

• I - one 21/2" square

School Building:

- J one 2½" x 10½" rectangle
- K four 1½" x 4½" rectangles
- L two 1½" x 3½" rectangles

Windows:

M - two 1½" x 4½" rectangles

Doors:

N - two 2½" x 5½" rectangles

Sewing Instructions

- 1. Sew the two N pieces together. If desired, top stitch down the center to accentuate the seam.
- 2. Sew one K piece to each side of each M piece. Then sew one L piece to the bottom of each KMK unit.
- 3. Sew the units from step 2 to each side of the doors from step 1. Then sew the J piece to top of the resulting unit.
- 4. Use the C pieces to snowball the upper left corner of one F piece and the upper right corner of the other F piece.
- 5. Using the two H pieces, snowball the top two corners of the I piece. (It will look like a tall flying goose.)
- 6. Sew the two G pieces to the top and bottom of the unit from step 5.
- 7. Sew the CF units from step 4 to the sides of the unit from step 6. (See the diagram above.)
- 8. Sew the roof unit from step 7 to the top of the schoolhouse unit from step 3.
- 9. Sew a B piece to each side of the unit from step 8.
- 10. Sew the A piece to the top of the unit from step 9.
- 11. Use diagonal seams to sew a D piece to each side of the E piece. (See the diagram above.)
- 12. Sew the unit from step 11 to the bottom of the unit from step 10.
