October 2023 Block of the Month - Pumpkin



Block size: 12" finished (12½" unfinished)

Cutting Instructions

Background:

- A two 11/2" x 121/2" rectangles
- B two 13/4" x 101/2" rectangles
- C two 2" squares
- D two 3" squares
- E one 2" x 5" rectangle

Stem:

• F - one 1½" x 2" rectangle

<u>Leaf:</u>

• G - one 2" x 5" rectangle

Pumpkin (various oranges):

- H two 3" squares
- I sixteen 21/2" squares

Sewing Instructions

- Draw diagonal lines on the back of the D pieces. Layer the D and H pieces, right sides together, and sew ¼" on both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the drawn lines. Open and press. Square each unit to ½½". (Makes four half-square triangles.)
- 2. Using the HSTs from step 1 and the I blocks, sew together four rows of five squares to make the pumpkin body.
- 3. Using the C pieces, snowball the top left and lower right corners of the G block. (See the diagram.)
- 4. Sew the F piece to the left side of the unit from step 3, then sew the E piece to the left side of the F piece.
- 5. Sew the unit from step 4 (stem and leaf) to the top of the pumpkin body from step 2.
- 6. Sew the B pieces to the top and bottom of the unit from step 5.
- 7. Sew the A pieces to the left and right sides of the unit from step 6.
