

A couple of irons that were used for quilt camp cannot be found. We don't know if they got broken, lost, or walked away. Please take a minute to look through your quilt camp supplies and make sure you didn't grab a guild iron by mistake.

One of our AccuQuilt dies has also gone missing. It was for the 'bowl cozy'. There is a binder in the cabinet with the dies which should be annotated anytime someone checks out or returns a die so we know who has them. It also allows us to see which are the more popular dies should we need to buy extra.

If you have any information about any of these items, please let Gretchen or one of the officers know. These items were purchased by the guild and need to be accounted for. We sometimes forget that the guild is actually a business and needs to be run as such. When items are purchased for guild use, that purchase is documented with receipts, etc. So when something wears out or gets lost, we need to make a record of that as well.

Block of the Month (BOM) 2024



• A - one 13¹/2" rectangle

• B - scraps for 14 wedges *

• C - one approx. 6" circle *

D - scrap for one head *
E - scraps for two legs *

• F - scrap for one beak *

Fusible material for pieces C, D, E,

- For raw edge appliqué, use Heat

- For finished edge appliqué, use Pellon Featherweight or similar



November 2023 Block of the Month - Turkey

This pattern was adapted from the Turkey Trot pattern from Missouri Star Quilt Company (MSQC). Video of this pattern is available from MSQC at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zU0EyZV23vQ.

Assembly Instructions

- 1. Mark the horizontal and vertical center of the background A piece by either folding and pressing or by using an erasable marker.
- 2. Cut 14 B pieces using the Mini Dresden template provided. If you have the MSQC Layer Cake Dresden Plate template, you can use it by cutting between the 1" and 4" marks.
- 3. Sew together the tops of each B piece, then turn and press to make the Dresden wedges. Sew all 14 pieces together, making sure that the top (folded) edges match. Fold over 1/4" and press the unfinished edges of the bottom two B blocks.
- 4. Using your interfacing method of choice, cut out and apply fusible material to your C, D, E, and F pieces. Piece C should be a circle of approximately 6" diameter. The other pieces should be per the provided templates.
- 5. Position all the assembled pieces approximately as shown in the diagram and press to set the fusible materials. When secured, stitch around all the appliquéd items using your stitch of choice.
- 6. Once all parts are sewn, trim the complete block to 12¹/₂" x 12¹/₂".
