From Your Program Chairman

In January we issued the Crayon Challenge. Members randomly pulled two crayons from a bag. The challenge is to use the colors pulled to create a project of any size. Background and an additional color may be added, if desired. The crayon colors need to make up most of the project, 50% or more.

At our April 4th meeting we will have a special show and tell for these completed projects. Please bring your project and your crayons. It will be exciting to see the imagination our members have put into their Crayon Challenge projects. There will be participation awards and prizes for Best Overall and Most Difficult Color Combo. I can't wait to see all the amazing ways people have used their two colors!

We will also be talking about all things Scraps. How small is too small? Do you cut them into uniform sizes? What sizes? Do you toss or donate them at the end of each project? How do you organize & store them? What projects do you make using them? Do they languish in your closets & cupboards? Are you overrun with scraps? We're going to come up with a plan to use them!

In May we'll have another guest speaker, Kent Sechrest of Kent's Sewing Machine Repair. In June we are going to consider our UFO's (unfinished objects) and make plans for getting them done or moving on.

Upcoming Workshops

We are delighted to have Vonda Blando returning to teach us the Laura Heine method of Collage. We will be making the sewing machine from Teeny Tiny Collage Pattern Group #5 which features 3 designs. Pincushion, Dress Form and Sewing Machine designs are full sized in the pattern and each finish at 16 x 20. General collage directions and color photos with step-by-step instruction are included in the pattern.

This class is open to guild members and friends. We do need to pre-register and pay for this class. Contact Gina Ames or sign up no later than the May 2nd guild meeting. Class is \$40, pattern is \$25 and should be purchased from Vonda. A supply list has been posted on Facebook and printed copies will be available at guild meetings.

June 15th Free Children's Quilt Workday. This is a totally free workday. The object is to set aside some time to make Children's donation quilts. We will be kitting up some of the guild's abundant fabric stash to make charm pack quilts. You can bring your own fabric or sew up a kit or two. This is a super quick pattern that makes a $41" \times 50"$ quilt. Fabric requirements: 405" squares and 11/4 yards background fabric.

August 17th Finishing Workday. This is another free workday where we finish our Children's Quilts, quilt and bind them. There will be demos of how to use your domestic sewing machine to quilt a quilt top. This should be a fun day dedicated to finishing several donation quilts.














Minutes from General Meeting on March 7, 2024



April 2024 Block of the Month - Friendship Star



Since we're friends here at the guild, I thought this was a great block choice. This is another block that has options. You can make your center different than your HSTs. You can use multiple colors for your star points. You can even make four of the 6" version and sew them into a 12" block. It's up to you!

Cutting instructions

For 12" Block

A - One 4.5" square

B - Two 5 1/8" squares

C - Four 4.5" squares

D - Two 5 1/8" squares

For 6" Blocks - Make Four

A - One 2.5" square

B - Two 3 1/8" squares

C - Four 2.5" squares

D- Two 3 1/8" squares



If making four 6" blocks, sew together into 12" block.

- Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the D background squares. Place <u>a D</u> square and a B square right sides together. Sew a ¼" seam on each side of the marked line.
- Cut on the marked line. Open up the pieces and press toward the darker fabric.
 Repeat <u>for</u> remaining B and D squares for a total of four half square triangles.
- 3. Trim half square triangles. For 6" block, trim squares to 2.5". For 12" block, trim squares to 4.5". This step is important for your block to be the correct size when finished.
- Assemble the quilt block in rows as shown.
 Sew rows together into <u>block</u>. Press row <u>seams</u> open.

A Bit of Modern Quilting

This month's improv quilting is a very relaxed approach to a 'log cabin' style quilt block.

Start with a 2-3" rough cut wonky square, then lay random sized strips around the center – on two sides – roughly to the desired size of the finished block.



Continue by stitching a strip to the top and right side, pressing and trimming as necessary.



Stitch one strip to the top of the square and press. Then stitch another strip to the right side of the square. After pressing, trim edges 'straight' while maintaining some wonkiness in your block.



After adding a few strips to two sides, this block can be trimmed to 6.5" -OR- more strips could be added to make a larger block.
