Upcoming Workshops to be held at Pottawatomie County Museum

September 21st 8am – 4pm – Project Jelly Roll Free Workshop. There are many variations of Jelly Roll Race Quilts. Bring a Jelly Roll or 42 - 2 ½" strips and a bit of coordinating fabric along with your sewing supplies. There will be at least three pattern options available for this workday. These make great donation quilts. Plan to attend and enjoy a fun day of quilting together. We will be having a potluck lunch.

November 16^{th} 8am – 4pm Disappearing Nine Patch Quilt Free Workshop. Join us for a fun day of sewing and fellowship at the Museum. In addition to your standard sewing supplies, you'll need fabric for making the 9 patch blocks. We'll use 5-inch squares, which can be purchased as pre-cuts or cut from yardage. A 52" x 65" quilt can be made with 180 5-inch squares. I plan to add a couple of borders and get a 64" x 77" quilt, great for youth donation quilts. Raffle Quilt

- The raffle quilt will consist of 42-9-inch (finished) blocks, set in a 6x7 pattern, with 3" (finished) sashing and cornerstones, and one 4" (finished) outer border. The finished quilt size will be 83" x 95". There will be 21 butterfly blocks, 7 tulip blocks, 7 posy blocks and 7 snowball flower blocks. Ann Cosgrove has agreed to quilt it when completed. We will need someone to finish the quilt.
- The background fabric is Kona Cotton sky. The other fabrics are from the "Coming Up Roses" collection by The Joy Project from Moda Fabrics.
- Block kits were checked out to members in attendance. <u>Completed blocks are due back at the September meeting</u>. Brigitte Winford will be assembling the blocks into a completed quilt top, then pass to Ann Cosgrove. Goal is to have the quilt finished by the end of this year.

September 2024 Block of the Month – Child's Play

This month's block is made entirely of half-square triangles. This is a great block for playing with pattern placement. The first example I used three prints and that creates a very different look than example two. The second example uses 8 prints and I placed the same print in opposite positions.

Cutting Instructions

For 12" Block

A – Eight 4" squares

B – Eight 4" squares

For 6" Block

A - Eight 2.5" squares

B - Eight 2.5" squares

- Draw a line diagonally & corner to corner on the wrong side of the lightest color square.
- 2. Arrange squares so they are "right sides together" (RST) and all edges are even. Stitch 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.
- 3. Cut the units apart on the drawn line and press the seams.
- 4. Trim to 3.5" square for a 12" finished block and 2" square for a 6" finished block. Make 16.
- 5. Arrange your HSTs and sew together into a block.
