Upcoming Workshops to be held at Pottawatomie County Museum

November 16^{th} 8am – 4pm - Disappearing Nine Patch Quilt Free Workshop. Join us for a fun day of sewing and fellowship at the Museum. In addition to your standard sewing supplies you'll need fabric for making the 9 patch blocks. We'll use 5-inch squares, which can be purchased as pre-cuts, or cut from yardage. A 52" x 65" quilt can be made with 180 5-inch squares. I plan to add a couple of borders and get a 64" x 77" quilt, great for youth donation quilts. November 2024 Block of the Month - Chisholm Trail





This block is named for the cattle trail from Texas, through Oklahoma to Kansas. It's a classic that has variations depending on your pattern placement. The first example I used two prints, and the second example uses 3 prints. Other variations exist; have fun choosing your version.

Cutting Instructions

For 12" Block

- A Two 4" squares, Print Fabric
- **B** Seven 4" squares, Background Fabric
- C Five 4" squares, Print Fabric
- D-Two 3.5" squares, Print Fabric

For 6" Block

- A Two 2.5" squares, Print Fabric
- B Seven 2.5" squares, Background Fabric
- C Five 2.5" squares, Print Fabric
- D Two 2" squares, Print Fabric

Draw a line diagonally & corner to corner on the wrong side of your background fabric, C.

You will make HSTs with A and B, as well as with C and B. Place "right sides together" (RST) and all edges even. Stitch 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.

Cut the units apart on the drawn line and press the seams.

Trim to 3.5" square for a 12" finished block and 2" square for a 6" finished block. Make 16.

Arrange your HSTs and D squares, sew together, paying attention to orientation.
