## From Your Program Chairman

It's a new year and I'm excited about all the good things we have planned for 2025! I've put together a calendar with Programs, Themed Show & Tells, Workshops and Quilt Show Deadlines. We're still waiting on Quilt Camp Dates so those are TBD. We have two guild members speaking as well as some special guest speakers lined up. I hope you all are ready for a fun year filled with fabric, friends and maybe learning a thing or two.

Jeri Albrecht will be our first guest speaker this year. On January 9<sup>th</sup> she will talk with us about our fabric collections, organization and planning.

On February 6<sup>th</sup>, Gretchen Gaskill will be speaking about quilting tools & notions. Be sure to finish up your Disappearing 9 patch quilts for our show & tell.

March 6<sup>th</sup> I will lead a discussion about quilt labels. We will talk about How & Why as well as look at some creative ways to get them labeled. Get your 2024 Block of the Month quilts finished for show & tell in March.

March 22nd & 29th our first workshop of the year at the Pottawatomie County Museum, Gretchen will be teaching the Missouri Puzzle quilt. The pattern is available from Missouri Star Quilt Co.

(https://www.missouriquiltco.com/products/digital-missouri-puzzle-quilt-pattern-by-missouri-star/) This is a two-color quilt, and the final size is 75"x75". It requires 4.75 yards of a dark fabric, and 3.75 yards of a light fabric. For best results, the fabrics should read as solids. (If you want to participate, but don't want to make a big quilt, a bed runner option is available. It requires only 2 yards of dark fabric and 1.25 yards of light fabric.)

Although this design looks complicated, it is only made up of four blocks: a half-square triangle, a rail fence, a 9-patch, and a plain square. You will want to get your fabric chosen early enough that you can get your strips cut prior to the workshop, so that you'll have time to get some or all of your blocks made.

# **Volunteer Opportunity**

We still need a volunteer to handle publicity. With the Quilt Show coming up this year, publicity will become a high priority. It could be a fun way to get more involved!

### Quilts Presented to World War II Veterans

We had the honor to present quilts and pillowcases to ten World War II Veterans at a party on December 21<sup>st</sup> at the Norman Veterans Home. (Actually only eight veterans were present at the party. The other two will receive their quilts at a later time.) The veterans ranged in age from 97 to 104. The oldest was a former Army Nurse. The veterans all seemed pleased to receive the quilts. We were even approached by the son of one of the veterans, himself a Vietnam veteran, to ask if he could request a quilt for himself.

Thanks to the quilters who donated quilts and pillowcases to honor these veterans. Quilts were made by Ann Cosgrove (3 quilts!), Cheryl Perrault, Regena Morton, Gretchen Gaskill, Gina Ames, June and Vicki Cramer, Karen Spears, and Quetha Hale (from Lisa's donation stash). We ended up with seven patriotic quilts, one Christmas quilt, and two non-specific quilts. Judy Branson made ten patriotic pillowcases.



# January 2025 Block of the Month - Thrifty

Carolyn Castle has volunteered to present Block of the Month this year with blocks in several sizes. Below are fabric requirements for all of the blocks in the 12" (finished) size. This is only for the blocks and does not include yardage for setting into a quilt. These are generous fabric allowances; with careful cutting you could use less. And if you make smaller blocks, you will also need less fabric.

Light fabric - 2 3/4 yards Medium fabric - 1 1/2 yards Second Medium fabric - 1/3 yard Dark fabric - 2 1/2 yards
